Simple conversations at home such as, "How do you think your friend felt?" or "How would you feel if that happened to you?" help children develop kindness, compassion, and understanding.

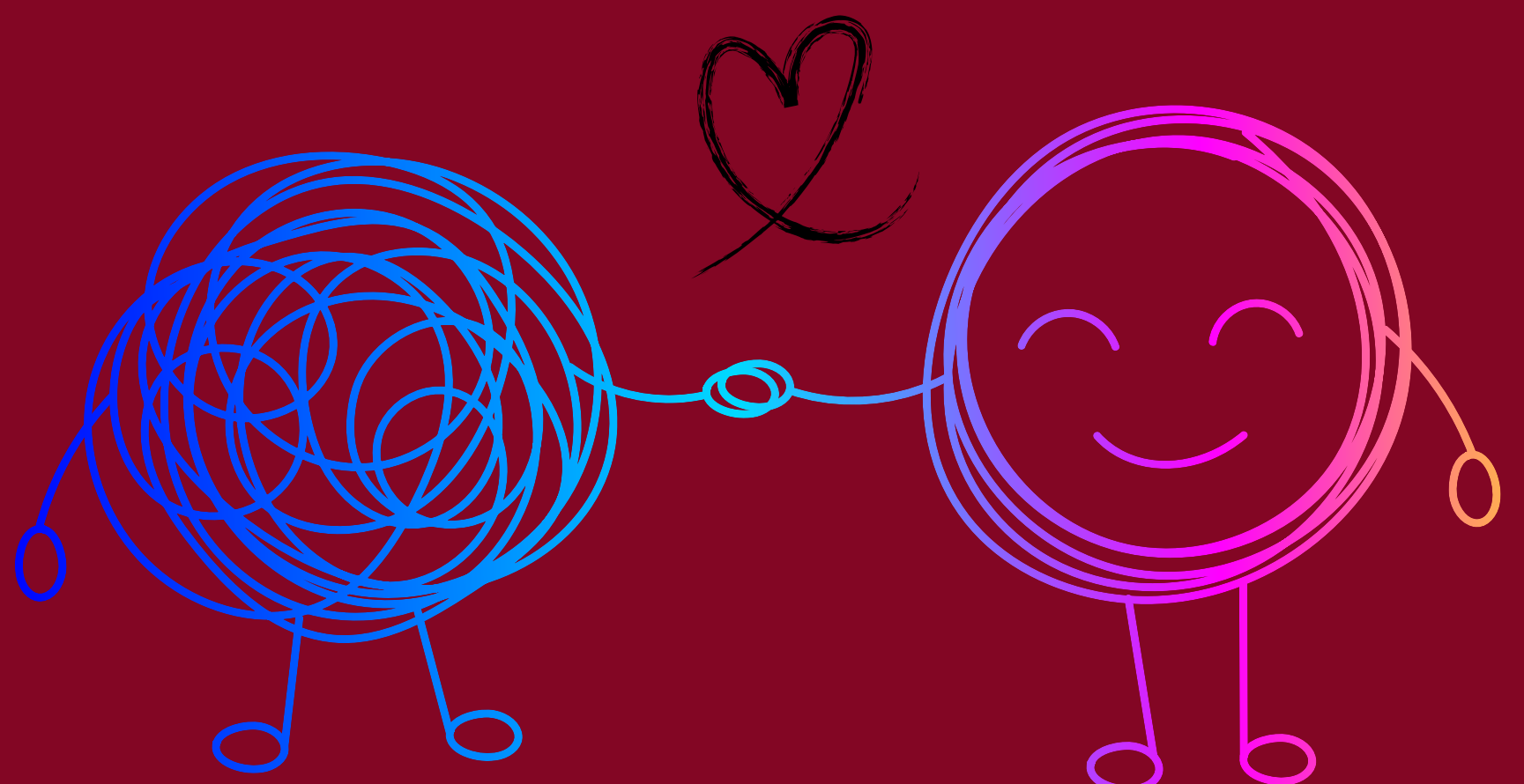

"Empathy is seeing with the eyes of another, listening with the ears of another, and feeling with the heart of another."

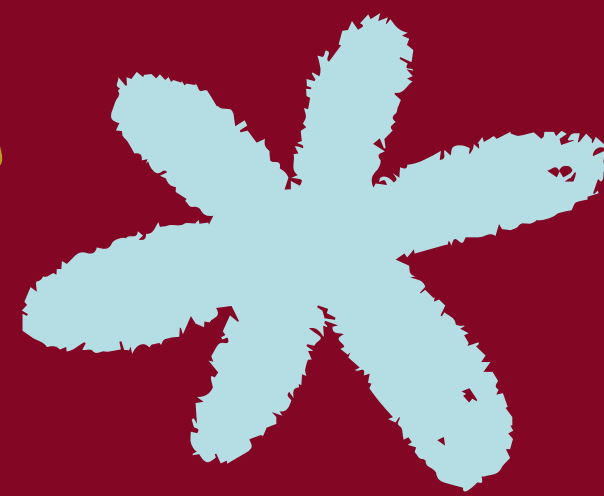
Together, let us encourage our children to stop, think, and choose kindness.

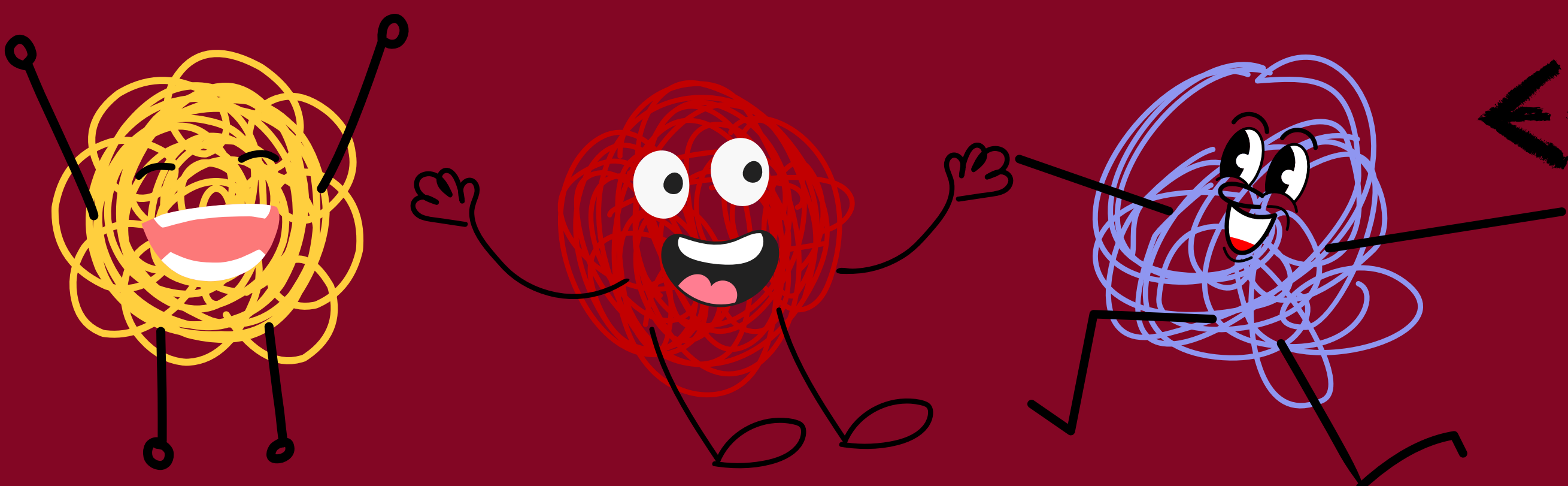
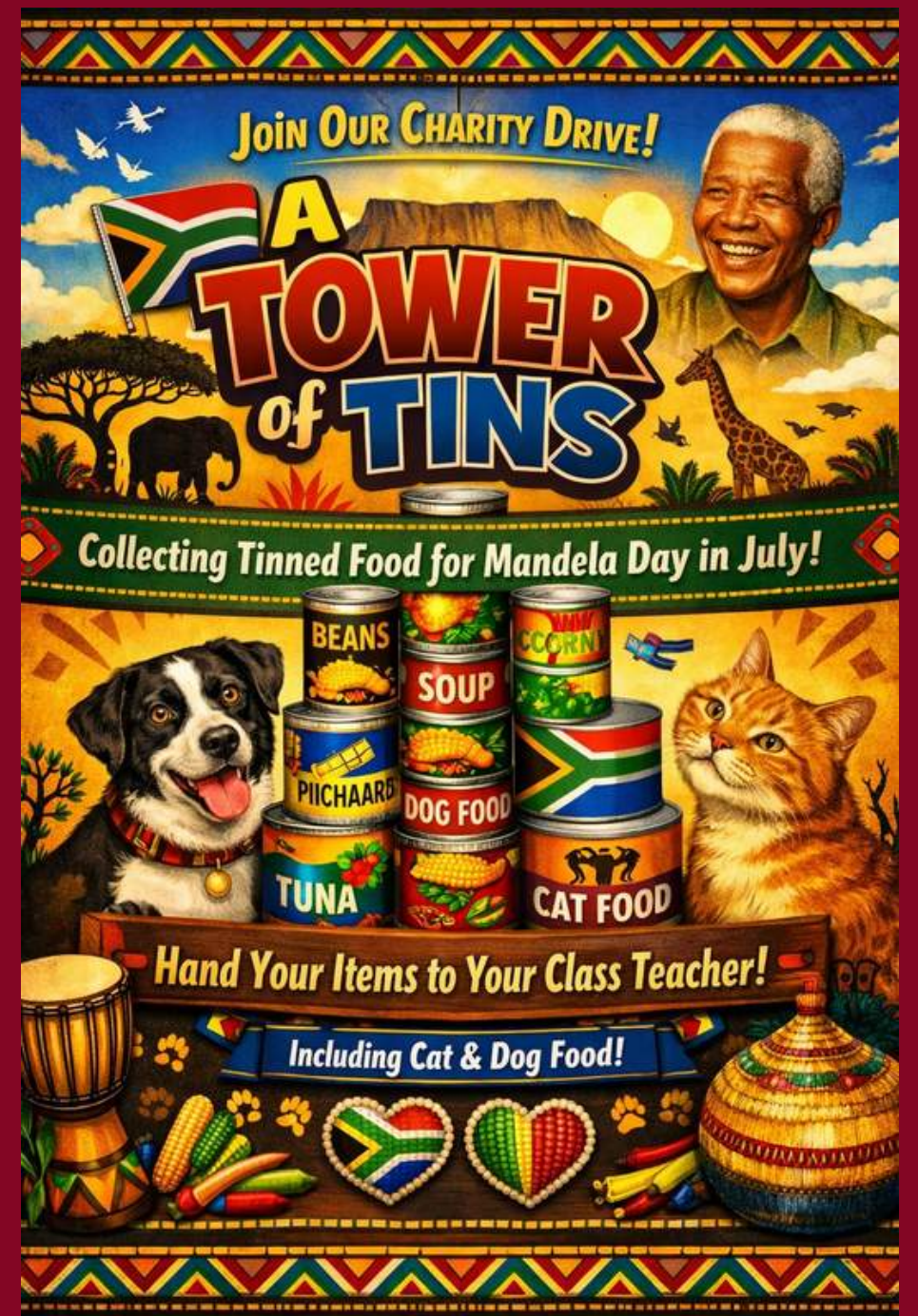

Flags Down, Excitement Up! The Race to the Final Begins!

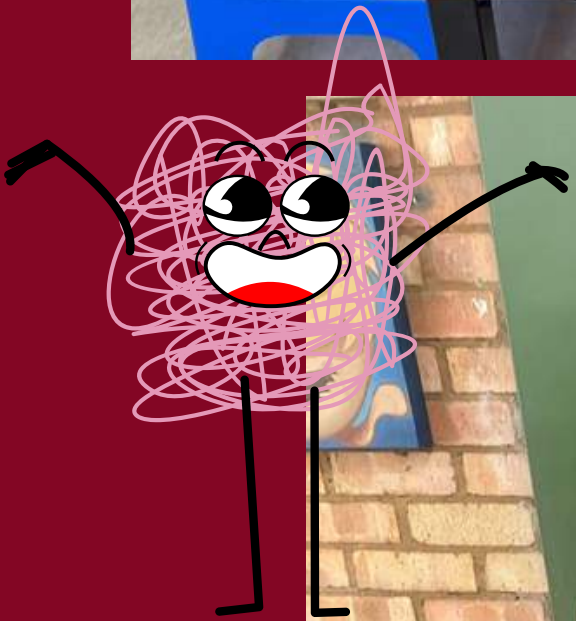
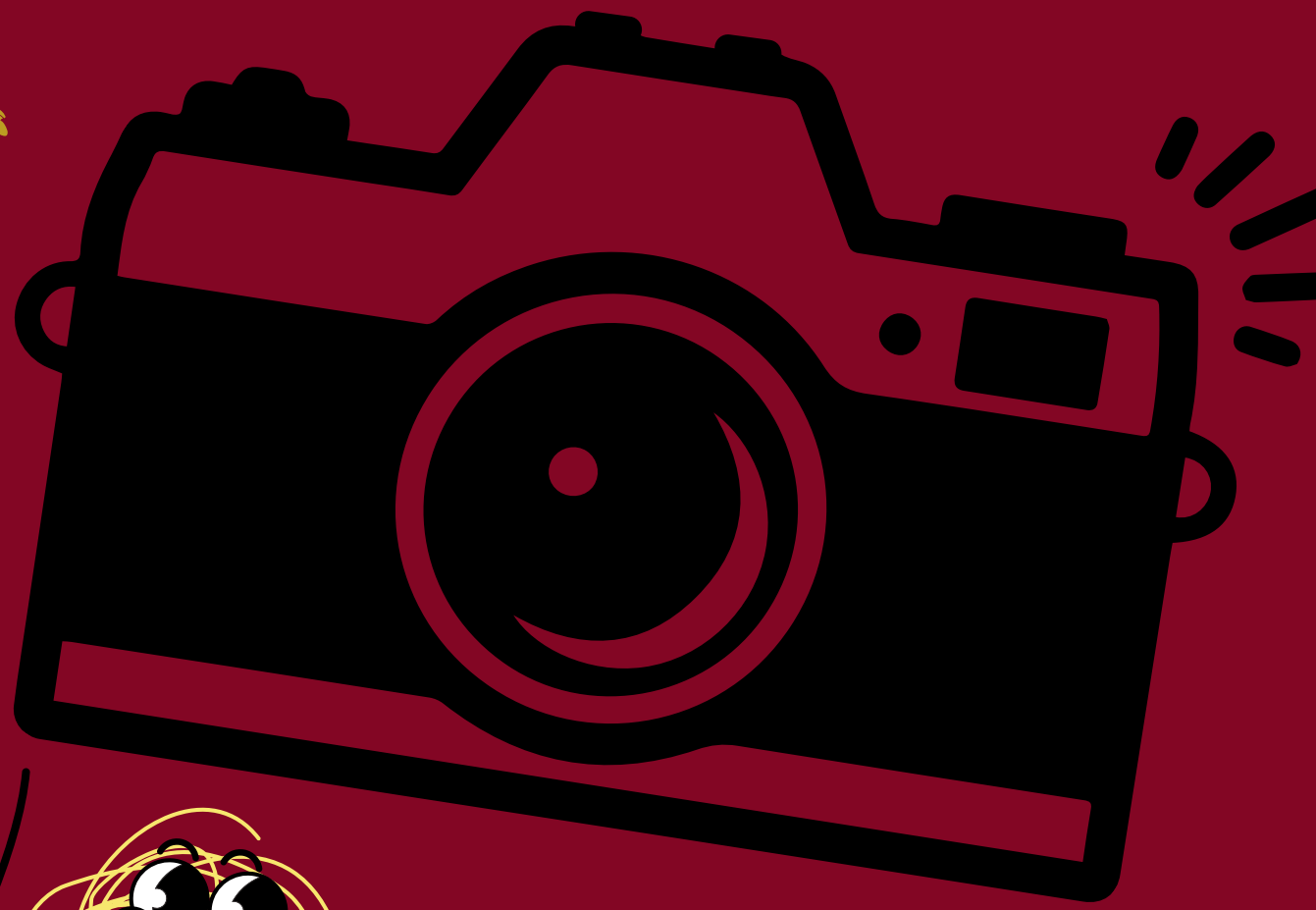


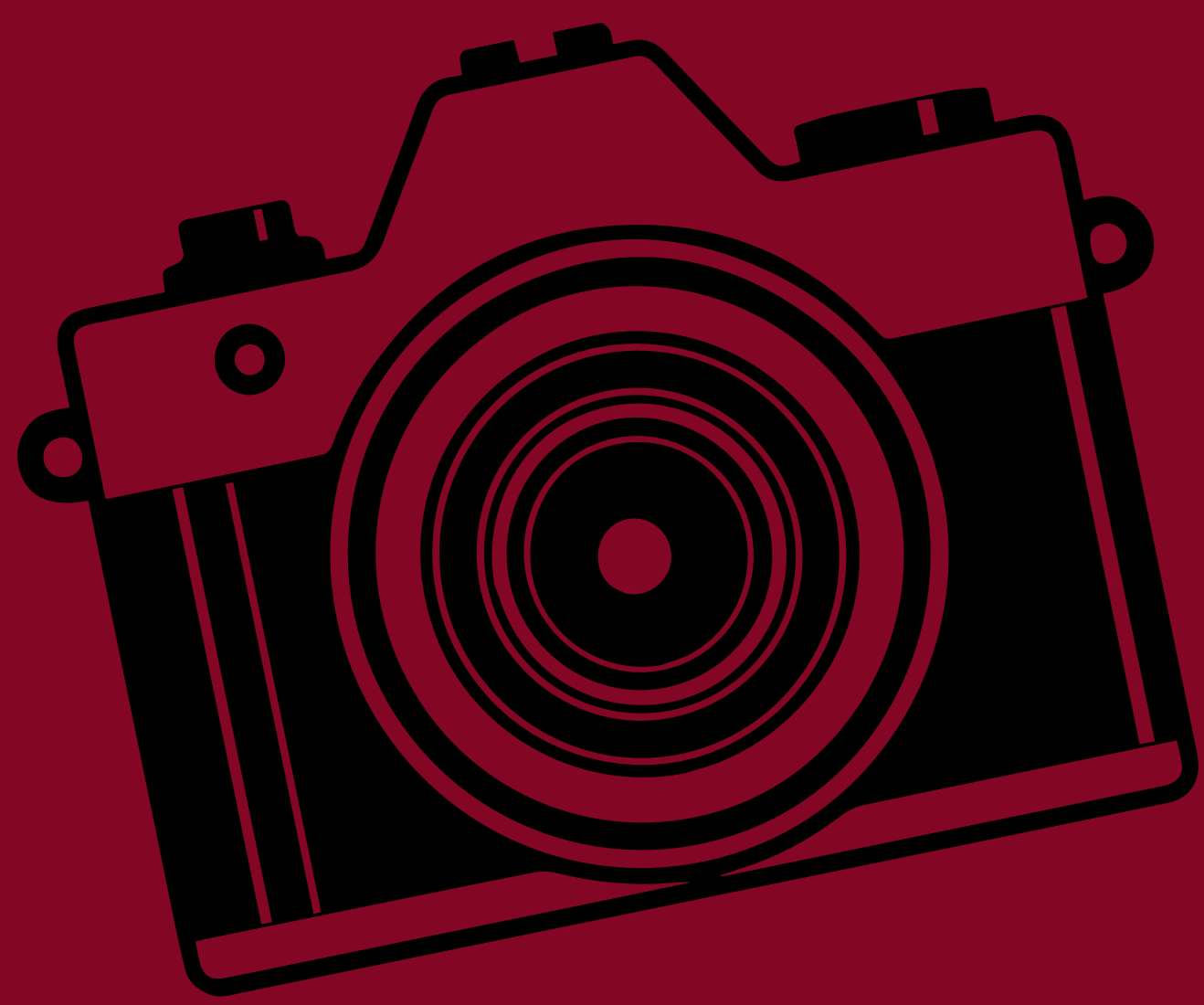
The excitement is building! The eliminated teams' flags are gradually being taken down around the Piazza, marking each step closer to the final showdown.

There are still many countries in the running as we edge towards finding our winning country, and those lucky participants in the raffle will soon be placed into the final draw!



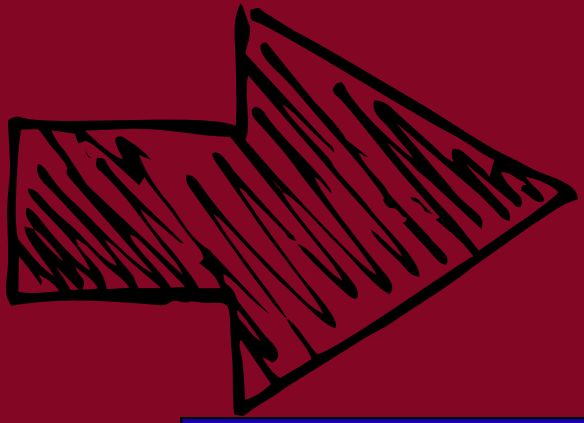
